## POST GRADUATE PHYSIOTHERAPY GRANT GUIDELINES

### BACKGROUND

Brian Lloyd established this charitable trust in 1985 in memory of his late wife. Felice was born in 1926, grew up in Melbourne and began studying physiotherapy in 1943. Following graduation in 1946 she worked at Fairfield Infectious Diseases Hospital and then in private practice.

In 1949 Felice travelled to England. Her intention was first and foremost to travel to Britain and Europe and then gain overseas postgraduate qualifications or experience. At the time these were more highly regarded than the Australian equivalents. In 1951 Felice married Brian Lloyd in Cambridge, England. Sadly, Felice died shortly afterwards in London in 1954 at the age of 27.

Since 1985 grants have been distributed annually, with the same intention as Felice had pursued in her career – to seek overseas experience in the field of physiotherapy.

### FELICE ROSEMARY LLOYD TRUST SUB-COMMITTEE

Applications are considered by the Felice Rosemary Lloyd Trust subcommittee. The sub-committee makes recommendations to Equity Trustees, being the trustee of the Felice Rosemary Lloyd Trust.

### GRANTS

The purpose of the Trust is to further the development of the physiotherapy profession in Victoria through research and education, by providing annual grants of up to \$10,000 that allow recipients to travel and study overseas. These grants are not intended to be purely about gaining post-graduate academic qualifications. The sub-committee gives at least equal importance to those applicants seeking to gain professional experience in the field of physiotherapy. Likewise, costs associated with attending conferences, air fares and food should not be a major component of an applicant's budget.



Preference for grants are given to:

- Individuals, less than 35 years old, who have graduated within the last five to ten years
- Graduates or professionals who wish to travel overseas to further professional expertise and knowledge in physiotherapy
- Graduates or professionals who can clearly demonstrate how they will disseminate the benefit of their study and experience to the physiotherapy profession in Victoria.

The Trust will look positively upon applicants who are able to obtain complementary funding from other sources or able to contribute toward the total cost.

Applicants should submit their application online which is available from 1 October each year in Equity Trustees website.

Flights, transportation, conference costs, courses and basic accommodation is able to be funded. Personal expenses, including a daily allowance will not be successful.

The committee meets in December to assess applications. Equity Trustees and the Felice Rosemary Lloyd Trust sub-committee are not obliged to provide feedback to unsuccessful applicants.

## **REPORTING**

Successful grant recipients are required to lodge a report at the conclusion of the grant detailing the achievements and evaluating the success of the activities for which funding was given.

In keeping with the Trust's aim to further the development of the physiotherapy profession in Victoria, the final reports lodged by successful applicants will be made available publicly through the website of the Australian Physiotherapy Association (the APA).

## **ACKNOWLEDGMENT**

Equity Trustees encourages organisations to publicly acknowledge the support received from a charitable foundation. In this case, the foundation to be acknowledged is the VCF – Felice Rosemary Lloyd Trust managed by Equity Trustees.

In March every year, Equity Trustees and the Committee organise an afternoon tea with previous year's grant recipients (who have already completed their overseas training) and those who received the grant in that year to give the recipients and the committee the opportunity to share the experience the previous recipients gained through the grant.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicants are required to apply through an eligible organisation such as their employer or an education institution where they are enrolled, as grants cannot be made to individuals;
- Applying institutions must have Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) Status – Item 1
- Applicants must be able to take up their grant offer within 12 months of the award
- Applicants must consent to permit the research or final report to being made publicly available through a central register such as the website of the APA.



## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING AN APPLICATION

To be considered for a Grant, an Application must be submitted online. The guidelines to the grant can be accessed via the Equity Trustees' website:

Applicants must ensure that a report complying with the Guidelines for Referee Reports is attached to their application at the time of submission. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure their referee completes and provides them with a referee report to attach to their application by the closing date.
